### God Does Not Change

Spring is in the air. The birds are singing. The sky is bluer. The grass is greener. The leaves on the trees are starting to bud and the flowers are starting to bloom. Spring symbolizes life. Spring is the one season that shows, in stark terms, how good always triumphs over evil, light over darkness, life over death. Spring, for many, is a symbol of new beginnings. When the first green emerges from the ground and the first bud opens, people all over the world celebrate life's triumph over death. The earth comes to life once more. Spring is steeped in love and joy - the essence of all that is good - and gives way to the ideas of rebirth, renewal, resurrection and regrowth. Spring symbolizes life in all its glory.

As Christians, we are given new life and new mercies every morning. Spring provides a wonderful reminder to us that we should be living a full life and leaving the old dead parts of life behind. There is always hope during the coldest, darkest winters of life. Spring will come and new life will come forth! So how can we take advantage of what God is doing in the spring of our life? Listen to God's Word in the Song of Songs 2:11-13, "See! The winter is past; the rains are over and gone. And as Paul reminds us to give thanks to God, "who in Christ always leads us in triumphal procession and through us spreads the fragrance of the knowledge of him everywhere" (2 Corinthians 2:14).

But the seasons come and go, so our focus needs to be on the God who is unchanged and unchanging. Things change so fast in our world that it's hard sometimes to keep up with all the changes. We turn on the television or glance at the newspaper and we see just how much our world has changed, not always for the better. It makes us painfully aware that our kids are growing up in a world far different than the one we knew as children. But amid all the changes one thing, one person, never changes—our eternal God. The psalmist writes, "Lord, you have been our dwelling place throughout all generations. Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the whole world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God" (Psalm 90:1, 2). The Lord is the one constant we can count on season after season.

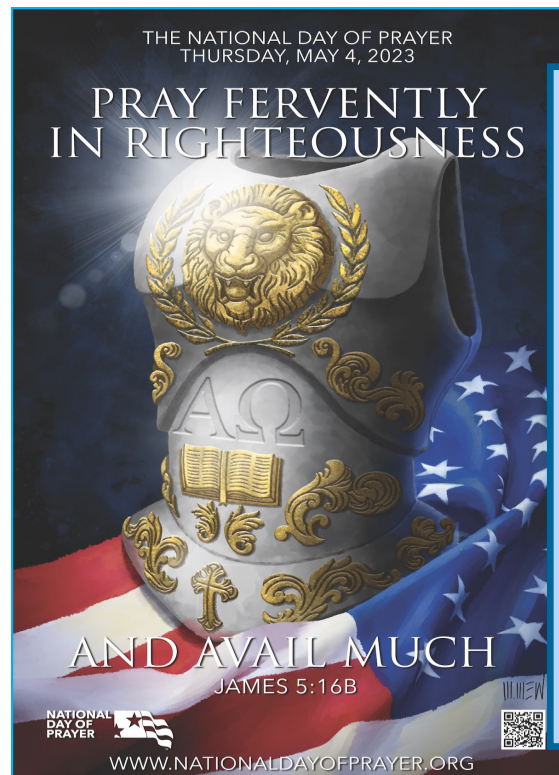

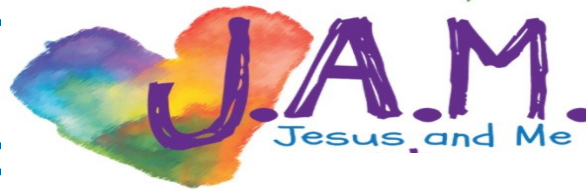


**TRAILS TEMPLE MINISTRY NEWS!!!**

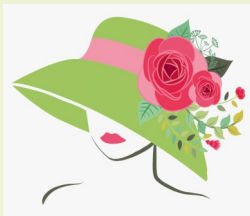

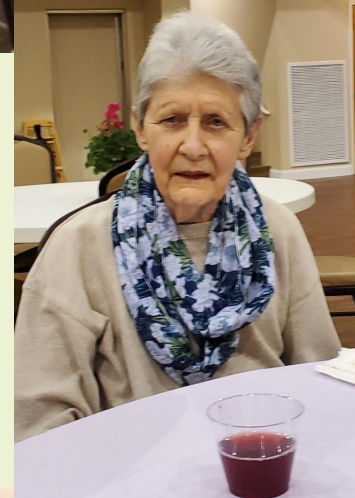

## Disaffiliation Fund Update

On May 7<sup>th</sup>, the Alabama-West Florida Conference of the United Methodist Church will meet to approve our congregation's February decision to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. At that time, our church will officially become the **First Methodist Church Wetumpka** and affiliated with the Global Methodist Church, which is fully congruent with our core beliefs.

In April our Administration Board met and voted to create a short-term Disaffiliation Fund to run until the end of this year to meet the financial cost of our congregation's decision to disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church. The \$75,000 goal of this fund will enable the full disaffiliation cost of \$172,767 to be paid without having to finance any portion of the amount through a bank. Any money raised over the \$75,000 amount will go back into the General Fund to replenish reserves. The \$172,767 amount is for our church's calculated portion of the Unfunded Pension Liability and Post-Retirement Medical Benefit for United Methodist clergy retired now and a calculated apportionment based on church size. Upon paying this disaffiliation cost the conference will release the title of all church property to **First Methodist Church Wetumpka**. The current total insured value of our church's physical properties is \$12,300,000. Therefore, the \$172,767 disaffiliation cost is not to purchase our property.

**As of April 16<sup>th</sup>, we have received \$28,640 toward the \$75,000 goal for our Disaffiliation Fund.** Thanks to all who have already given to this fund and to all who are giving prayerful consideration to give now or before the end of this year. You may contact Sonya Arnold, Financial Secretary, to let her know you wish to make a specific commitment to this fund before yearend. To make a tax-deductible donation, please memo your check, envelope, or online gift for Disaffiliation Fund.

It is indeed a blessing to report that giving to this special fund is not impacting the faithful giving to the general fund needs of our 2023 budget. Through Easter Sunday, which is 15 weeks in our budget year 2023, the general fund collections are 2.15% ahead of 2022 collections. On behalf of the full array of ministries provided through our church, thank you for faithfully responding to God's call to give your prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness for Kingdom work.

### ***Moving Forward...***

*Here is our new logo and the importance of each detail. Thank you Andrea and Jamie for working so hard on making just the right logo for us!*

From the design team: After much prayerful discernment and talking to Matt and other members about the heart of, and vision for, the church moving into this new season, this logo design is the outpouring of those events, discussions, and God's guidance.

**The goal:** To create a logo that honors our past, looks to where God is guiding us forward, and conveys the heart and vision of our church to all who see it. (To love everyone inside and outside of our congregation as Christ does)

-**The cross** in the middle of the heart is pulled from our old logo to honor our church's history

-**The blue ring**, broken up into 3 circular parts, represents the Godhead Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) while also making a nod to the three rings in the Global Methodist Church logo referencing the Trinity as well

-**The blue of the circle** is official Global Methodist Church blue to represent

where God is leading us currently

-**The hand at the innermost part of the blue circle and close to the heart**, in combination with the encircling nature of the design element it is attached to, is meant to convey to those looking at it as embrace. When this idea is linked with the cross inside the heart it surrounds, and the fact circles can also make people think of the shape of the world; the goal is for those who see it to understand our church's heart, and as a result vision and atmosphere, is to embrace and love everyone as Christ does.
