A Word From Our Pastor...

During my time at Asbury Theological Seminary, I wrote many papers but the paper that stood out was on the history of prayer in the Christian tradition. The prayer most often used down through the ages was the Lord's Prayer. It was quite clear that God's people received their spiritual direction from this prayer. The Lord's Prayer is a summary of the Gospel and it is the most memorized, quoted, and sung by the church. It was also the focal point of prayer for the early church fathers.

John Wesley said, "God will do nothing but in answer to prayer. Whether we think of, or speak to God, whether we act or suffer for him, all is prayer, when we have no other object than his love, and the desire of pleasing him. Proceed with much prayer, and your way will be made plain." Prayer helps us to stay on the path marked out for us by God.

Recently, I ran across a prayer guide for the Lord's Prayer by pastor and author, Rev. Dr. Terry Teykl. He breaks down the Lord's Prayer for daily use, along with a Scripture reference, for you to pray through. As you pray through the following prayer points, invite the presence of the Lord into your prayer time. As you pray allow time to listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to you. Then, consider what action steps you might take in response to the Lord's leading. Repeat this prayer pattern weekly for the month. **Remember, prayer changes everything!**

Sunday: Pray-'Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name.'

Praise Him for He is a good Father. (Psalm 145:9)

Pray that God's name would be revered and honored in Sunday morning worship and that the Name of Jesus is lifted high.

Pray that we speak the Name of Jesus often and in awe. (Hebrews. 1:1-4)

Monday: Pray—'Thy kingdom come,'

Pray for your local schools (administrators, teachers & students), city leaders, and first responders.

Pray for God's authority over the crime and illegal activities in your city. (1 Corinthians 15:33)

Tuesday: Pray—'thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.'

Pray for those who are the lost, to be set free to be saved and to find a church family. (2 Peter 3:9) Pray that we will see glimpses of heaven here on earth.

Wednesday: Pray—'Give us this day our daily bread.'

Pray for the needs of the poor, homebound and oppressed people in our communities and the world. Pray expectantly that God would meet their needs.

Give thanks for God's bountiful goodness. (Psalm 100)

Pray that we will repent of our sins. (1 John 1:9)

Pray that we will repent of our attitudes of pride.

Pray that we will forgive others.

Friday: Pray-'And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.'

Pray that we are not led into selfish gain, self-deception, lust, unbelief, judgmental attitudes, or greed.

Pray for protection from evil, especially for our pastors and church leaders. (Psalm 91)

Saturday: Pray—'For thine is the kingdom, and the power and the glory, forever. Amen.'

Pray that we are filled with the Holy Spirit. (Acts 1:8)

Pray that God's power is made manifest and His glory revealed in our lives and in our church. (Luke 9:1-2) **'This, then, is how you should pray.'**

May God bless you and your family during the month of September, as we turn to God in prayer and practice the principles of prayer.
