A Word From Our Pastor...

Set Apart

What does it mean to be set apart by God? When a person places their faith in Jesus Christ and becomes a believer, he or she is sanctified—that is, set apart for God's purpose. Unlike salvation, which takes place in a single moment, sanctification is a lifelong process. When we allow the Word of God and the Holy Spirit to work in our life, God sanctifies us into His likeness. In other words, we increasingly mature in our faith.

Paul explained God's purpose for believers this way: "For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son" (Romans 8:29). Our character, our conduct, and our conversation should be reflections of Christ. Thankfully, we have been given the Holy Spirit, who works through God's Word to renew our minds. But we must cooperate in the sanctification process by filling our minds with Scripture. It has been said that, 'The Bible is God's living word for our daily living.' We need it just like the air we breathe.

The Lord shows you how to think and act so you can "walk in a manner worthy of the calling with which you have been called" (Ephesians 4:1). We are different than the rest of the world because we are a sanctified people. We are separated from what is unholy and called to be holy. So, what are some distinguishing marks that separate us from the world?

First, you are acceptable. Eugene Petersen paraphrases "You are the ones chosen by God... from nothing to something, from rejected to accepted" (1 Peter 2:9,10). Most of us spend our entire lives trying to earn acceptance. Even with our character flaws, shortcomings, insecurities, and immaturity, God accepts us, just the way we are. But He loves us enough to not let us stay that way.

Secondly, you are valuable. How much do you think you are worth? I am not talking about your net-worth; I am talking about your self-worth. We should never confuse valuables with the value of a person. So, how does God determine value? The Bible says, "You have been bought and paid for by Christ, so you belong to him" (1 Cor. 7:23 NIV). God exchanged his own Son for you. The cross proves your value. Jesus gave his life for you. To Jesus, we are the most precious treasure in the entire world.

Lastly, you are capable. Now that may sound a little intimidating to you. But as a believer in Jesus Christ, you are part of "a royal priesthood" (1 Peter 2:9). So, what are the benefits of being part of this priesthood? Well, you have direct access to God. You have the right to go directly to God with your prayer concerns, your supplications, and your confessions. We can experience the power and presence of God directly.

You also have a responsibility to minister to the needs of other people. Every Christian is a minister. God says that you and I have been gifted for ministry to serve other people. We are "God's instruments to do his work and speak out for him, to tell others of the night-and-day difference he made for us" (1 Peter 2:9). We are agents of God. We speak to God for people. This is our ministry of prayer, especially intercession. We also speak to people for God. This is our ministry of witnessing; sharing our transformation story with others.

Knowing who God has set you apart to be, will empower you to be all that you can be for Jesus and his kingdom. If you ask Jesus, he will tell you. You are accepted, you are valued, and you are capable. What more could you want? May God continue to bless you and your family during the month of October.






