

As we approach Holy Week and prepare to celebrate the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus, let us be reminded of the Passion of Christ. On the night on which he is arrested, Jesus endures the trial of the Sanhedrin. They examine Jesus and determine he deserves to die. They send him to Pontius Pilate. The Roman governor, examines Jesus, and decides he is innocent. So Pilate sends Jesus to be judged by Herod Antipas because as a Galilean he was under his jurisdiction.

Herod was excited at first to see Jesus and hoped Jesus would perform a miracle for him and asked Jesus several questions but Jesus did not answer. Herod then mocked him and sent him back to Pilate after giving him an "elegant" robe to wear. The Jewish leaders and the crowd demand Jesus' death. Pilate gives them the choice of saving Barabbas, a criminal, or saving Jesus. In response to the screaming mob Pilate sends Jesus out to be crucified.

Once condemned by Pilate, he was flogged before execution. The whole detachment of soldiers were called together and they placed a purple robe on him, put a crown of thorns on his head, and put a rod in his hand. They mocked him by hailing him as **"King of the Jews,"** paying homage and hitting him on the head with the rod. Pilate had Jesus brought out a second time, wearing the purple robe and the crown of thorns, in order to appeal his innocence before the crowd saying, **"Here is the man."** But the priests urged the crowd to demand Jesus' death. Pilate resigned himself to their decision, washing his hands before the people as a sign that Jesus' blood would not be upon him.

Jesus is made to carry His own cross. Upon arriving at Golgotha, Jesus was offered wine laced with myrrh to lessen the pain, but he refused it. Jesus was then crucified. The soldiers divided Jesus' clothes except for one garment for which they cast lots. Some of the crowd taunted Jesus, saying **"He trusts in God; let God deliver him now!"** The crowd hoped that Jesus might perform a miracle to release himself from the cross. He did not!

At midday the sky became dark and the darkness lasted for three hours, until the ninth hour when Jesus cried out, "**My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?**" A soldier pierced his side with a spear and found Jesus had already died. The centurion standing guard, who had seen Jesus die, declared Jesus to be the innocent Son of God.

Jesus did not endure this suffering for nothing. He endured the cross for you and for me. As Christians, we can have salvation through the finished work of the cross. Jesus left his place of honor and came to earth so that you may have life, and have it to the full. Praise God!

During the month of March, be reminded of the joy of your salvation and the price that Jesus paid. However, and most importantly, let us be reminded to live our lives in a way that brings glory and honor to Jesus our King.

Two months into 2024, it is with great joy to report that we are indeed moving forward into this year from a position of stewardship strength . . . demonstrating our faithful commitment to participate in God's vision through our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness.

You are a vital part of continuing a remarkable heritage of serving God and making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. For more than 205 years, blessings have come through the faithful commitment of our church family to give their time, talents, and treasure out of love for Christ. Even during the exceptional world challenges of the past five years, we thank God for leading our spiritual and numerical growth, and working through us to make a greater impact in our community as servants of Christ.

Certainly, financial generosity is essential to the growth of our mission and ministry outreach. Dennis Fain, our treasurer, provides an overview that reflects the impact of your generosity. *The First Methodist Church Wetumpka has been in a continued growth mode for the last 5 years. This growth is evident in the church's increased outreach to our membership and community.* Outreach services require financial commitment from our church family; and, this is evident in that our General Fund budget has trended upward from \$549,339.00 in 2020 to \$628,927.00 for this year 2024. This represents a 14.50% increase in funding our work areas and staff to accomplish God's extensive plan for our church.

Praise the Lord, our congregation continues to step up to meet financial needs. Gratefully, we received formal pledge commitments from 79 families toward meeting the 2024 General Budget requirements. In addition, we are grateful to another 63 givers who faithfully give to meet the church's financial obligations without making written pledges.

During the past five years, the trustees have been diligent in maintaining our church physical property, including to replace the covering over our beautiful stained-glass windows in the sanctuary and the chapel. Several air conditioning units have also been replaced during this time. Of course, all maintenance items require financial commitments from our church family to help the church remain financially sound and able to cover our expenses. I am happy to say our church financial status is sound, and our general fund collections have increased each year over the last five years. Our church continues to be abundantly blessed.

Together, we are living Ephesians 4:16 - *From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.* This is evident as God is working through our good stewardship to change lives . . . through the witness of our worship, study, fellowship, and service. Let's keep doing it!
