A Note from our Pastor...

Pleasing to Him

Jesus said, "The Father has not left me alone, for I always do the things that are pleasing to him" (John 8:29). Do you know the feeling of accomplishment and satisfaction in a job well done. That happens when you give it your all, when you do your very best. My brother Steve and his wife Amy have two boys, Jake and Josh. Steve and Amy are very proud of both of them and all their accomplishments. So, when their oldest son Jake started playing football, they were excited to see what he might achieve on the gridiron. Jake was not only big for his age; he was a good football player, as well. When Jake played, Steve usually stood on the sidelines watching every down. But before each play began, Jake would look to the sidelines to make sure his father was watching him. Jake wanted nothing more than to please his father and Steve would show his approval by celebrating his accomplishments. A child can ask for nothing more than his or her father's approval and encouragement.

In the gospel of John, Jesus said, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work" (John 4:34). As Easter People, we know that Jesus completed all the work that his Father sent him to accomplish and he did it well. To finish the work the Father had given him was obviously high on Jesus' list of urgent goals. We are encouraged by Jesus to finish our work a few chapters later when he says to his disciples, "As long as it is day, we must do the work of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work" (John 9:4). We all have an allotted time to complete our work here on earth. Are you doing that work?

At the end of his ministry, Jesus reported to his Father, "I have brought you glory on earth by completing the work you gave me to do" (John 17:4). When Jesus said this, he could not have meant that his salvation work was complete because his salvation work was finished on the cross. However, it is possible that Jesus meant that he had completed the work of equipping his disciples. Consider this because at the end of his prayer in John 17, Jesus said, "As you sent me into the world, I have sent them into the world" (John 17:18). As followers of Jesus Christ and as sent people, we must do the work of Him who sends us.

Jesus had recreated himself in his disciples. All the gifts and graces that Jesus had, were imparted into his disciples. He was sending them into the world, equipped to continue the work which God the Father had sent him into the world to do. As the Book of Acts reminds us, they did it the same way he had done it. They imitated their Lord.

How about you, are you imitating Jesus? Are you equipping others to do the work of the kingdom? Jesus' style of equipping is not too complicated to understand but it is costly. Equipping others calls for us to invest time in another person's life. It requires us to be patient, vulnerable and open with the people we are equipping. It takes an intentional effort on our part to equip a fellow believer for ministry. But the rewards are immeasurable because the next generation will hear the Good News.

During the month of May, let us continue the work God created us to do in ways that are pleasing to the Father and may God continue to bless you and your family.

Southern gospel singer Ivan Parker will be singing in our 10 a.m. worship (NO 8 a.m. worship) on Sunday, June 23.



Ivan Parker is an American Southern gospel singer. He was raised in Sanford, North Carolina, where his father was a pastor in a Pentecostal church. In 1982, Parker joined the Singing Americans, and in 1983 he became lead vocalist of the Dove Award-winning group the Gold City Quartet. As a member of Gold City, he was named Favorite Lead Vocalist by Singing News from 1988 to 1993, and was named Favorite Male Vocalist from 1989 to 1995 and 1997. He was inducted into the Alabama Music Hall of Fame in 1993.

In January 1994, Parker began recording as a solo artist, and in 1995 he joined Bill and Gloria Gaither on the "Homecoming" tour. He continued touring with the Gaithers for 16 years. Occasionally, he would sing with tenor Kirk Talley, and pianist/baritone Anthony Burger in a group they called simply The Trio. From 2001 to 2004 and 2006 to 2016, The Singing News named him Favorite Soloist. In 2007 and 2008, he was voted Male Vocalist of the Year in the Singing News Fan Awards.

May is Mental Health Awareness Month!

Did you know approximately 1 in 5 adults in the United States experiences a mental illness and only half of them receive treatment. One in 20 have lived with a serious mental illness such as schizophrenia, bipolar disorder, or major depression. The average delay between the onset of mental illness symptoms and treatment is 11 years. Half of all mental health disorders show signs prior to the age of 14. Many factors can contribute to mental illness including biological factors, life experiences, and family history. Suicide is the leading cause of death in the United States. There are currently more treatments, services, and community support systems than ever before. If you or a loved one experience a mental illness, do not suffer in silence. The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) offers resources for those diagnosed and family members of those affected with mental illness. 
