A Word From Our Pastor...

The Light of the World

As we bring the year 2024 to a close, I have some good news and some bad news: You are eternal. Your spirit will live forever. You have a free will and you can choose where you will spend eternity. Daniel reminds us, "Multitudes who sleep in the dust of the earth will awake; some to everlasting life, others to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise will shine like the brightness of the heavens, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever" (Daniel 12:2-3). Here in Daniel, we have a depiction of the resurrection for both the righteous and the wicked. Although the eternal fate of each will be quite different, "God will repay each person according to what they have done" (Romans 2:6). As Malachi reminds us, the *Day of the Lord* will be both great and dreadful.

In his book, *The Pursuit of Excellence*, Ted Engstrom writes, "I was cleaning out a desk drawer when I found a flashlight I hadn't used in over a year. I flipped the switch but was not surprised when it gave no light. I unscrewed it and shook it to get the batteries out, but they would not budge. Finally, after some effort, they came loose. What a mess! Battery acid had corroded the entire inside of the flashlight. The batteries were new when I had put them in, and I had stored them in a safe, warm place. But there was one problem. Those batteries were not made to be warm and comfortable. They were designed to be turned on—to be used."

This month as we focus on Jesus, the light of the world, we should be reminded that we were created to be turned on, to let our light shine. Jesus said, "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven." God shows us how we can shine like the brightness of the heavens, like stars and lead many to righteousness. When we share the light of Christ with others, we can be brightly shining stars—radiantly beautiful in God's sight.

One way to let your light shine is to show compassion to others. Jesus expressed deep compassion for all people. You can let your light shine, as you practice humility. Christians are called to be humble in all things, knowing that it is only through the grace of God that we live and move and have our being. Generosity is another way to let your shine light. Christians are called to be generous with our time, resources, and love. Yet another way to let your light shine is through forgiveness. Jesus taught that we should forgive others as we have been forgiven. There are many other ways to let our light shine before others.

During the month of December, find ways to let your light shine, as you share the light of Jesus. May God continue to bless you and your family as you shine like brightly shining stars.


From the Finance Committee:
