## A Word From Our Pastor...

#### A Firm Foundation

Paul wrote to the church in Corinth, "The foundation that has already been laid is Jesus Christ, and no one can lay down any other foundation." Are you building your life on the firm foundation that is Jesus Christ? If so, then you are building a life worth living. That building process means spending time every day in the Word and in prayer – not just reading and learning, but applying God's truth to your life.

It has been said, "A nation married to its cultural beliefs will soon be a widow." As Christians, we are to follow God's Word; not the world and its cultural beliefs. Jesus is the foundation, that we must build our lives upon. Jesus's foundation that will never change, never give way, and never let us down.

Jesus expressed the need for a firm foundation in the Parable of the Two Builders, where He teaches on the importance of building your house on solid ground. So, the question you must ask yourself, "Am I building my life on the solid rock?" That's exactly what we see the people doing in Corinth. They are building on a great foundation that has already been laid.

When you make that decision to give your life to Jesus, that you are altogether His, it becomes a watershed moment in your life. When you place your life into God's hands, from that day forward you belong to him, you are no longer your own. Then everything about your life changes because you are building your life on a firm foundation that will never change, never give way, and never let you down.

In that moment you become devoted to the Kingdom of God and to your Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and empowered by the Holy Spirit. God's desire is for you to be fully devoted to Him, to do His will and obey His commandments. It is a complete and daily surrender. Service to God then becomes one's lifelong mission.

I am not saying that we should not be faithful and committed to our career. That's not what I mean. We still need to be faithful and serious in our vocation because God has put us there for a reason. I believe to be His witnesses and to reflect Christ in all that we say and do. We must see that our entire life is directed toward our service to God. We do everything as unto the Lord, for the purpose of obeying God's will and pleasing Him. That is the reality of devotion.

Devotion to God also means serving others. When you are devoted to God, as a Christian you want to tell others about Jesus because He is the cornerstone of your every heartbeat and breath. Then it is easy for you follow Jesus' lead and serve others.

During the month of October continue building on the firm foundation that is Jesus Christ, be devoted to Him in all that you do and serve others. May God continue to bless you and your family.




The Finance Committee announces its Annual United Appeal Fundraiser on Sunday, November 23, immediately following the 10:00 a.m. worship service.
