A Word From Our Pastor: "The Things of God"

One organization says that the mind is a terrible thing to waste and it is. We waste our minds on filth, on drugs, on alcohol, on Facebook or anything else that keeps us from being focused on the things of God. It has been said that we only use about 10% of our mind. Would you ever consider living in 10% of your house or living on 10% of your income? Probably not, so why waste 90% of your mind.

In Matthew 16 we read, "From that time on, Jesus began to show his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and undergo great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and on the third day be raised. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him, saying, 'God forbid it, Lord! This must never happen to you.' But Jesus turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; for you are not setting your mind on the things of God, but on the things of man."

Prior to this encounter, Jesus asked his disciples, 'Who do you say that I am?' Peter gives an A+ answer when he says: 'You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.' From Jesus' point of view this is a brilliant answer. Peter got it right! Jesus even goes on to say, 'You are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it.' I can't think of higher praise than this from Jesus. Few places in the Gospels does Jesus lavish such high praise on another person.

I can't believe any of us would enjoy praise more than when we receive it from a teacher or a mentor. Most people I know really light up when a teacher says, 'That's a very good answer,' or 'Excellent job, you've certainly done your homework.'

Do you remember when someone heaped praise on you this way? If you do then perhaps you can relate to how Peter felt when Jesus, the ultimate teacher, praised him. It was as if Jesus said to him, 'Peter, come to the head of the class.' Unfortunately, we all know that Peter's brilliance was short-lived.

It happened like this, after Peter's correct answer, Jesus explained exactly what 'The Messiah, the Son of the living God' really meant. In fact, Jesus did not exactly tell the gathered disciples, rather: 'Jesus began to show his disciples.' Perhaps Jesus even demonstrated what it meant to undergo 'great suffering at the hands of the elders and chief priests and scribes.'

Apparently, this dose of reality from Jesus was too much for Peter, because that's when Peter took Jesus aside and began to rebuke him. No doubt, Peter had begun to realize not only what was going to happen to Jesus but what was also going to happen to those who follow such a Messiah.

So, what is the reason for Peter's apparent fall from grace? My best guess is that Peter is not setting his mind on 'the things of God.' Jesus' statement is the fundamental line of the passage and it serves as a warning against double-mindedness. To be a disciple of Jesus Christ is to be a person without a divided mind. We are as we think. To have a divided mind is to sit on the fence, and fence-sitting creates second-rate disciples. To be a good and faithful disciple, we must make-up our minds about who the Messiah is and then follow Jesus on his terms and not on our terms.

As you continue to follow Jesus on his terms, trust God's higher purpose and plans for your life. Align your will with his, even if it requires sacrifices and challenges. During the month of November, may God continue to bless you and your family.
